

DREAM JOB

Aim: Give Ss practice describing jobs using gerund phrases and comparisons.

Preparation: Make one copy of the worksheet for every group.

Materials: None

Plan

- Divide the class into small groups. Give each group a worksheet.
- Go over the questions.
- Ss discuss the questions in groups. Encourage them to use gerund phrases and comparisons.

Prepare

A

- Explain the task. Ss in each group agree on a job they're all interested in. Then they write questions they want answered.
- Outside of class, Ss research the job. Explain that they can use the Internet, magazines, and newspapers or talk to someone with the job.

B

- In the next class, Ss compare the results of their research.
- Have Ss work in their groups to write short- and long-term goals to get the job.

Present

- Have groups share the goals with the class. Encourage other Ss to ask questions.
- **Option:** Without identifying the job, groups share the goals. Other Ss guess the job.
