THIS IS YOUR LIFE!

Aim: Give Ss practice describing rites of passage using time clauses.

Preparation: Make one copy of the worksheet for every S.

Materials: Magazines; scissors; colored pencils or pens; glue or tape

Plan

- Give each S a worksheet.
- Go over the questions. If necessary, refer Ss to the rites of passage in the Snapshot on page 72 of the Student's Book.
- Ask Ss to answer the questions. Then elicit answers.

Prepare

- Divide the class into small groups.
- Explain the task. Groups choose someone to interview and write questions they want to ask the person.

B

- Tell Ss to interview the person they chose as a group. You can give Ss class time to interview people at the school, or assign it as homework.
- Have groups make a scrapbook based on the answers in the next class. Encourage Ss to draw pictures of people, ticket stubs, souvenirs, announcements, or invitations.

■ Have Ss share their scrapbooks with the class. Remind them to explain the significance of each event.
