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Introduction

Who is Writing Extra for?

Writing Extra is a resource book containing photocopiable materials for supplementary classroom work. The activities provide self-contained lessons for the busy teacher. Each activity consists of a page of clear, step-by-step instructions for the teacher and a photocopiable page for the students. The material is aimed at young adults (16+) and adult learners; however, most activities can be easily adapted for the needs of younger students. Writing Extra offers teachers an exciting collection of topic-based skills activities from elementary to upper-intermediate level.

How will Writing Extra help my students?

Writing Extra is designed to make your students want to write. It motivates them through a variety of activities such as role play, puzzle-solving and text analysis, which enable students to practise all four skills while focusing on a definite written outcome. By providing meaningful contexts which lead to practical writing tasks such as e-mail, letters, reports and diaries, it encourages students to develop an awareness of both the reader and the specific form being practised.

How is Writing Extra organised?

Writing Extra is divided into 18 units, each focusing on a different theme. Each unit approaches the theme from an interesting and original angle. The themes cover many of the popular topics found in standard coursebooks. Therefore the activities can be used to supplement existing course material, offering diversity and a refreshing approach to these familiar themes. Each unit offers three activities at the following levels: elementary, intermediate and upper-intermediate. A map of the book provides a clear overview of the 54 activities, enabling the teacher to quickly locate a suitable activity for their class. A Writing tool kit at the end of the book includes reference sheets for students on style and organisation.

How is each activity organised?

Each activity has one page of step-by-step teacher's notes and a photocopiable sheet on the opposite page for the students.

There is minimal preparation before class. Usually teachers simply have to photocopy and cut up the appropriate number of sheets.

The teacher's notes include a key information panel for quick reference. The headings in this section are:

Level elementary, intermediate or upper-intermediate

Topic a brief description of the topic, e.g. *Identifying famous people*

The lesson is divided into these three stages:

Warm up – provides the context and some vocabulary for the task

Main activity – sets the task and generally presents a model or template

– students produce the first draft, which they sometimes correct using

a checklist

Follow up — students can do further optional practice or practise a connected form,

either in class, if there's time, or for homework



What is the best way to use Writing Extra in the classroom?

Each Writing Extra activity focuses on a practical task which explores the style and content of a particular form and thus encourages students to concentrate on communicating effectively. Many activities employ paired or group writing to enable students to develop their own pieces in a supportive atmosphere. By pairing an imaginative student with a more linguistically confident classmate, the teacher can enable both to produce a better piece of writing than either could produce on their own. Encouraging students to draft initially on alternate lines also enables them to refine their piece later on without rewriting the whole thing. By promoting such focused drafting, redrafting and self-evaluation, using the material in the Writing tool kit at the back of the book, the teacher can encourage students to take control of their own learning.

Through realistic real-world content and a mix of light and serious topics, *Writing Extra* encourages students to draw on their existing knowledge and skills in their written pieces: supported by models and templates, they produce realistic written texts through a process of informed criticism. This releases the classroom teacher to become audience and assistant, constantly monitoring and offering support and advice. Once the piece is finished the teacher can join with the student, who may well become their own best critic, in evaluating the piece! The Writing tool kit includes checklists, correction codes and an evaluation scale to further this end. It also includes photocopiable students' reference sheets on organisation and style, some suggestions on potential resources such as the Internet and further tips on using the book.

This book is part of a family of skills books in the Cambridge Copy Collection series. The other books available are *Listening Extra*, *Speaking Extra* and *Reading Extra*, and they each follow a similar format.

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
