Tom walks into his father's office and his father turns and looks at him. 'Hello, Tom,' he says. 'What are you going to do with your birthday money?' 'I don't know, Dad,' Tom says. 'Can we go shopping?'

Tom's father is looking at his computer again. 'Not today, Tom,' he says. 'I must finish this work. Where's Annie?'

'She's shopping with her friends,' Tom says.

He knows his father isn't listening. He's reading an email on his computer.

'That's nice,' he says, but he doesn't look at Tom. 'Have a good time!'

'OK,' says Tom and he leaves the room.

Tom phones his friend Neil. Neil's mother answers. 'Can I speak to Neil?' Tom asks.



'I'm sorry,' Neil's mother says. 'He's playing football in Winston Park³. Is that Tom?'

'Yes,' says Tom.

'Neil tells me it's your birthday today,' Neil's mother says. 'Happy birthday!'

'Thank you,' says Tom.

'I must go, but have a good day!' says Neil's mother.





Chapter 2


The camera



Tom leaves the house and walks to Winston Park. He doesn't like football, but he wants to be with people.

It's a hot day. In Winston Park there are lots of mothers and fathers with their children. Boys and girls are running and laughing. Everyone looks happy. Tom sees Neil and some more boys. They're playing football. Tom goes over. Neil sees him. He smiles. 'Hello, Tom!' he calls. 'Happy birthday!'

'Thank you!' Tom calls, but Neil is running to get the ball.



Tom watches the game⁴ for ten minutes, but Neil doesn't speak to him again. Neil's good at football and he's enjoying the game. Tom starts walking across Winston Park.

He sits down on a seat and takes a drink from his bag.



He puts his bag down. There is another bag under the seat.

'What's this?' thinks Tom. The bag is black. Tom opens it. He's looking for a name. There is only one thing in the bag: a camera.



Tom takes it out. Then he looks in the bag again, but there is nothing in it. No name.

Tom looks at the camera. There are four buttons: PHOTO, DELETE, ON and OFF.



Tom puts his finger on the ON button and presses⁵ it. The camera makes a noise.

The black bag is on the seat. Tom can see it in the camera. Tom puts his finger on the PHOTO button. He presses it. The camera makes another noise. Tom looks at the photo of the bag. It's OK, but he doesn't want a photo of a bag, so he presses the DELETE button. The photo goes away.



'This camera is OK,' Tom thinks. 'But it isn't my camera. I must take it to the police. I can buy a camera with my birthday money.'

Tom puts out his hand to take the camera bag from the seat. But the bag isn't there.

He looks under the seat. No bag. He looks behind the seat. No bag. Tom doesn't understand. 'Where is the bag?' he thinks.

A squirrel runs in front of the seat. Tom wants a photo of it. The squirrel stops.




'It's looking for food,' Tom thinks. He smiles and presses the PHOTO button. But when he looks at the photo, it isn't good.

'Squirrels are too fast for photos,' Tom thinks.

He presses the DELETE button. The photo of the squirrel goes away.



When Tom looks for the squirrel, he can't see it. 'Squirrels run fast,' Tom thinks. 'But not that fast. Where is it?'



Tom looks at the camera. He doesn't understand. Something is wrong. He wants to try the camera again. There are some flowers next to his seat. Tom looks at the camera again. He can see the flowers. He presses the PHOTO button and takes a photo of the flowers.

Then he presses the DELETE button to make the photo go away. Tom takes the camera away from his face. He looks for the flowers. They aren't there.

'The flowers are gone,' he thinks. 'Gone!'

'I must tell Neil about this!' he thinks. He puts the camera in his bag and starts running across the park.




But after a minute he stops running. He thinks about the camera bag, the squirrel and the flowers. He's near the boys now.

'It's my birthday,' he thinks. 'I want Neil to come to the shops with me. We can get a pizza. I can buy something with my birthday money.'


A boy in a blue T-shirt has the ball now. He's running fast. Then everyone shouts.

'It's OK,' he says. 'I've got another ball in my bag.' 'Good,' says Neil. 'But where is our other ball?'



'I don't know,' says the boy.

He gets the new ball from his bag. They start to play again.

Tom thinks about taking a new photo: a photo of the new ball. But the boys run away across the grass and Tom turns and starts to walk home.

When Tom gets home, his father is making a coffee.




'Tom? Is that you?' he calls.

'No thank you,' answers Tom. 'I'm just getting something from my room.'







'Gone,' he thinks. 'They're gone.' And he smiles. His mother comes back into the kitchen. She looks all over the room.

'Tom?' she says. 'Where are the cups and plates?' Tom thinks for a few⁹ seconds.

'It's the camera,' he tells her. 'When I take a photo, things go away.'

'What's this?' she says and takes it from her brother. 'Is it new?'

'Give it to me!' Tom says.

Annie doesn't listen. She puts the camera to her eye. She looks at Tom.

'Smile!' she says.

'No!' Tom shouts. Annie presses the PHOTO button. 'Give the camera to me, Annie!' Tom shouts. Annie looks at the photo.



'This isn't a good photo of you, Tom,' Annie says. 'No! Don't press any buttons!' shouts Tom. But it's too late. Annie presses DELETE.
