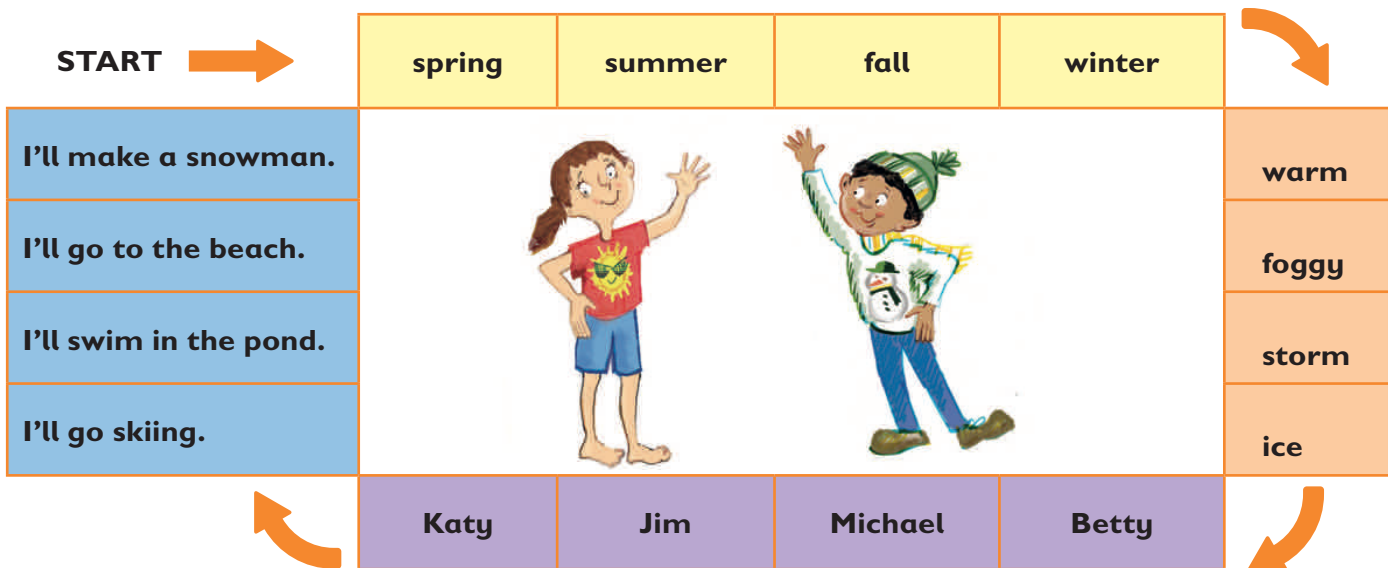


Let it snow!

1 Your spaceship has the number 1569. Put this number on your calculator.

2 You are going to go into space on December 28, so add 1228 → $1569 + 2805$

3 Your spaceship has three parts, so multiply by 3 → $1569 + 1228 \times 3$

4 It's time to leave and count down! So subtract 10 → $1569 + 1228 \times 3 - 10$

5 You're traveling with two astronauts, so multiply by 2 → $1569 + 1228 \times 3 - 10 \times 2$

6 There are eight planets in our solar system, so add 8 → $1569 + 1228 \times 3 - 10 \times 2 + 8$

7 The International Space Station is 350 kilometers above the earth, so add 350 → $1569 + 1228 \times 3 - 10 \times 2 + 8 + 350$

8 350 kilometers is 218 miles, so add 218 → $1569 + 1228 \times 3 - 10 \times 2 + 8 + 350 + 218$

9 After two days, you get to the ISS, so multiply by 2 → $1569 + 1228 \times 3 - 10 \times 2 + 8 + 350 + 218 \times 2$

10 You go around the Earth 16 times a day: that's 64 times in four days. Add 64 → $1569 + 1228 \times 3 - 10 \times 2 + 8 + 350 + 218 \times 2 + 64$

11 You fall asleep and dream that you're 40! So add 40 → $1569 + 1228 \times 3 - 10 \times 2 + 8 + 350 + 218 \times 2 + 64 + 40$
