



Unit 3 Story: Guidelines for parents and guardians

- Gina: A story, please, Dad!
- Dad: Be patient, Gina! Eat your food, please.
- Gina: A story, please, Dad!
- Dad: Be patient, Gina! Clean up, please!
- Gina: A story, please, Dad!
- Dad: Be patient, Gina! Wash your face AND your hands, please!
- Gina: A story, please, Dad!
- Dad: ... Yes, a story.
- Gina: Dad? ... Dad?! ... Good night, Dad!

Cut out the five pictures on worksheet part 1. Point to the young giraffe and ask her name (Gina). Ask who the other giraffe is (Gina's dad). Encourage your child to name objects and furniture in the pictures. Ask what is happening in the story (the child tries to remember and explain in his/her own language). Read the story script and help the child put the pictures in the correct order. Check with Student's Book pages 28 and 29.

Give the child glue and the second part of the worksheet. He/She sticks the pictures down in order into the blank frames. When he/she has finished, talk about what is happening in the story again (Gina wants her dad to read her a story, but he asks her to do other things first (eat her food, clean up, wash her face and hands). Gina is very patient and does everything he asks. Then when Gina is ready to read, her dad falls asleep.). Practice the repeated phrases from the story: A story, please, Dad. and Be patient. The child can then color the pictures.
