

DEBATE

Aim: Give Ss practice using time clauses in a debate.

Preparation: Make one copy of the worksheet for every 24 Ss.

Cut each copy into six slips and put them in a bag.

Comment: Use after or in place of the Speaking on page 74.

- Ss work in groups of four.
- Each group picks a slip from the bag. Explain that each slip has two important events or milestones on it.
- Explain the task. Two Ss choose one event and two choose the other. They have a debate over which one is more important in a person's life and why. Before they start, allow Ss time to work in pairs and think of arguments to support their case.
- Model the debate with one group:
 - T: Choosing a college major is more important than graduating from college.
 - S1: I don't agree. Until I graduated from college, I hadn't felt what it was like to be independent.
 - S2: But your major is more important because . . .
- Give Ss a time limit. After Ss have finished, ask which pair presented a stronger case.
- **Option:** After Ss have finished their debates, choose one topic and have a debate with the whole class.
