

CONCENTRATION

Aim: Give Ss practice using tag questions in a matching game.

Preparation: Make one copy of the worksheet for every four Ss.

Cut out the cards and put them into envelopes, one for each group.

Comment: Use after the Pronunciation on page 104.

- Ss work in groups of four.
- Give each group an envelope.
- Ss take out the cards, shuffle them, and spread them out face down in a grid, four by five.
- Explain the memory game. Each S turns over two cards. If they are a match, the S reads the sentence aloud, keeps the pair of cards, and takes another turn. If they aren't a match, the cards are returned to the grid face down in the same place, and the next S takes a turn.
- The game ends when all the cards are gone. The S with the most cards at the end wins.
- Go around the class and give help as needed. If Ss are not sure whether they have a match, they should ask you for help. Ss can play several times, scrambling the cards each time.
- **Option:** When Ss finish the game, they can read the matching cards and discuss whether they agree or disagree with the questions.
