- 1.62 **actor** (n) ηθοποιός
My favourite actor is Daniel Day Lewis - he was brilliant in all the films he played!
- 1.63 **camera operator** (n) οπερατέρ, χειριστής κάμερας
My cousin is a camera operator and he meets lots of famous actors on the set every day!

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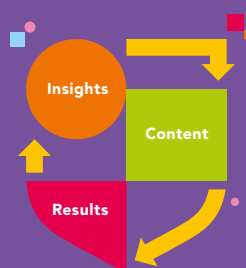
