OVER THE YEARS

Aim: Give Ss practice describing changes using the passive.
Preparation: Make one copy of the worksheet for every two Ss. Cut the copies in half.
Comment: Use after the Grammar Focus on page 45.

- Give half the class picture A and half picture B.
- Ss work in pairs, one A with one B. Point out that they cannot look at each other's picture.
- Write these verbs on the board: reduce, replace, displace, contaminate, cut down, build, construct, demolish. Explain the meanings of the verbs as needed. Tell Ss to try to use each verb once, and that there is more than one possibility for some items.
- Set the scene: Pictures A and B show the same town, but one is from 1960 and one is showing the town now.
- Student A and Student B will describe their pictures to each other and identify eight differences.
- Model the task with a S:
 - T: In picture A, there are factories making a lot of smoke.
 - S: In picture B, there isn't any smoke.
 - T: OK, so air pollution has been reduced.

- When Ss have identified the differences, they write eight sentences to describe them, using the verbs on the board.
- Ss look at each other's picture to check answers.

Answers

Answers will vary. Some possible answers:

- 1. Air pollution has been reduced.
- 2. The park has been replaced.
- 3. The street vendors/sellers have been displaced.
- 4. The river has been contaminated.
- 5. The trees have been cut down.
- 6. More bridges have been built/constructed.
- 7. High-rise apartments have been constructed/built.
- 8. The theater has been demolished/replaced.

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
