The photos are of large-scale farming done in plastic greenhouses, called plasticulture. These greenhouses are in Almería. The problem is all the plastic waste plasticulture creates.

- 2 Plasticulture is large scale agriculture that uses plastic for tent greenhouses and other applications.
- 3 The plastic protects the soil and keeps the temperature and humidity constant.
