Site from which a Field Battery has been moved thus 

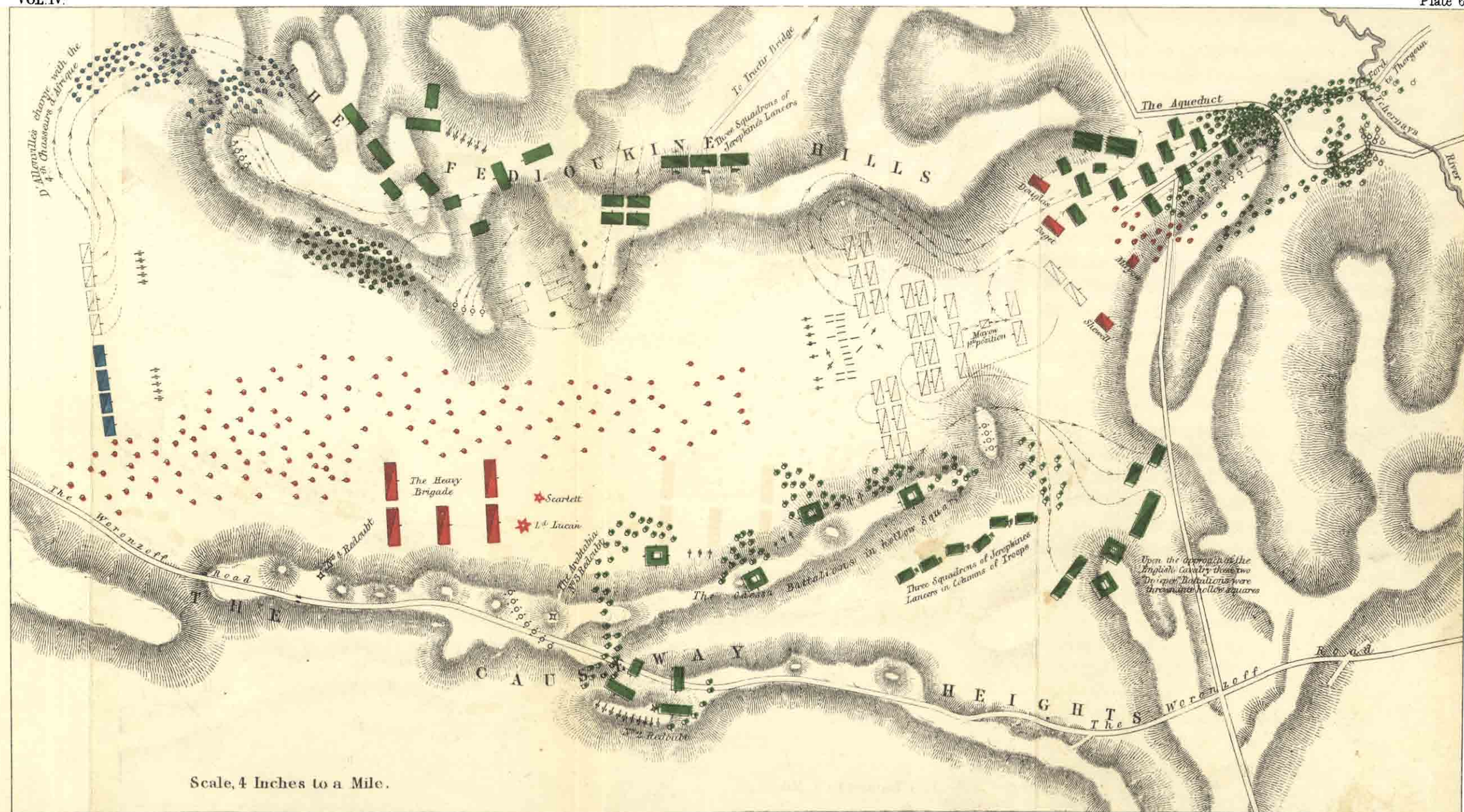
At this time, the Russian Battery had been captured by the Light Brigade and the whole mass of the Russian Cavalry in rear of it having been put to flight, the small remains of our Light Cavalry were pressing the retreat of the Enemy's squadrons, Captain Jerns commanding the 16th Light Dragoons was with some few of his troopers amongst the English horsemen in the front.

The disordered state of the Battery was occasioned by the brave and pertinacious efforts of the Russian Artillerymen to timber up and withdraw their guns in despite of the English horsemen then in actual occupation of the Battery.

Numbers of wounded and disabled horsemen of the Light Brigade are retreating up the valley.

D'Allonville's charge is taking effect and has silenced the whole of the fire from the Fediukine Hills.

On each side of the valley there are three Squadrons of Jermukines Lancers which had not shared the defeat sustained by the main body of the Russian Cavalry.
