strategus, killed in battle at Eleusis
(457 B.C. ? Isae. v. 42)

Menexenus I, killed at Spartolus in 429
while in command of the cavalry (Isae. v. 42)

Polyaratus of Choulargus ([Dem.] 40. 6, 24, 25), assessor of a Hellenotamias in 410/9 (C. I. A. I. 188. 22)

daughter, wife of Cephisophon of Paeania, secretary of the Council, 403/2 (Isae. v. 5. 10 n.)

Proxenus, strategus in 346 (Aesch. 2. 133, Dem. 19. 50, 52), tried and condemned before 343 (Dem. 19. 280), one of the sureties for the Chalcidians in 340 (C. I. A. II. 804 B. a. 4), a commander in the war of 339/8 (Din. I. 74)

Cleomedon, son of Cleon the demagogue, χορηγός after 403/2 (C. I. A. II. 553)

daughter ([Dem.] 40. 6)

Mantias, son of Mantitheus of Thoricus

daughter, married to Eryximachus, brother-in-law of Chabrias ([Dem.] 40. 24)

Menexenus IV, speaker of Isae. v., trierarch, 356/5 (C. I. A. II. 794 b. 67)

Bathyllus

Periander, author of the trierarchic symmories of 357 ([Dem.] 49. 21), trierarch (C. I. A. II. 793 f. 19) in 357/6

Menexenus II (epitaph in C. I. A. II. 2232)

Dicaeogenes IV, strategus in 325/4 and 324/3 (C. I. A. II. 811 b. 189, 811 c. 134, epitaph in C. I. A. II. 2232, married to Eucoline, daughter of Aristogeiton of Aphidna)

Harmodius, mentioned in 325/4 (C. I. A. II. 809 c. 49)

Cleon, trierarch in 356/5 (C. I. A. II. 794 b. 83)
