




Canada 2014 small gap treatment – with party labels




Canada 2014 large gap treatment – without party labels
















United States 2018 control (both studies)






Figure A3.2a: The Impact of Poll Exposure on the Amount of Time Spent Gathering Information, According to Party Identification





Figure A3.2b: The Impact of Poll Exposure on the Amount of Time Spent Gathering Information, According to Political Sophistication

Figure A3.2c: The Impact of Poll Exposure on the Amount of Time Spent Gathering Information, According to Confidence in Polls



Figure A3.2d: The Impact of Poll Exposure on the Amount of Time Spent Gathering Information, According to the Size of the Lead



Figure A3.2e: The Impact of Poll Exposure on the Amount of Time Spent Gathering Information, According to the Mode of Presentation of Polling Results



Figure A3.2f: The Impact of Poll Exposure on the Amount of Time Spent Gathering Information, According to Whether or Not Parties Were Named


