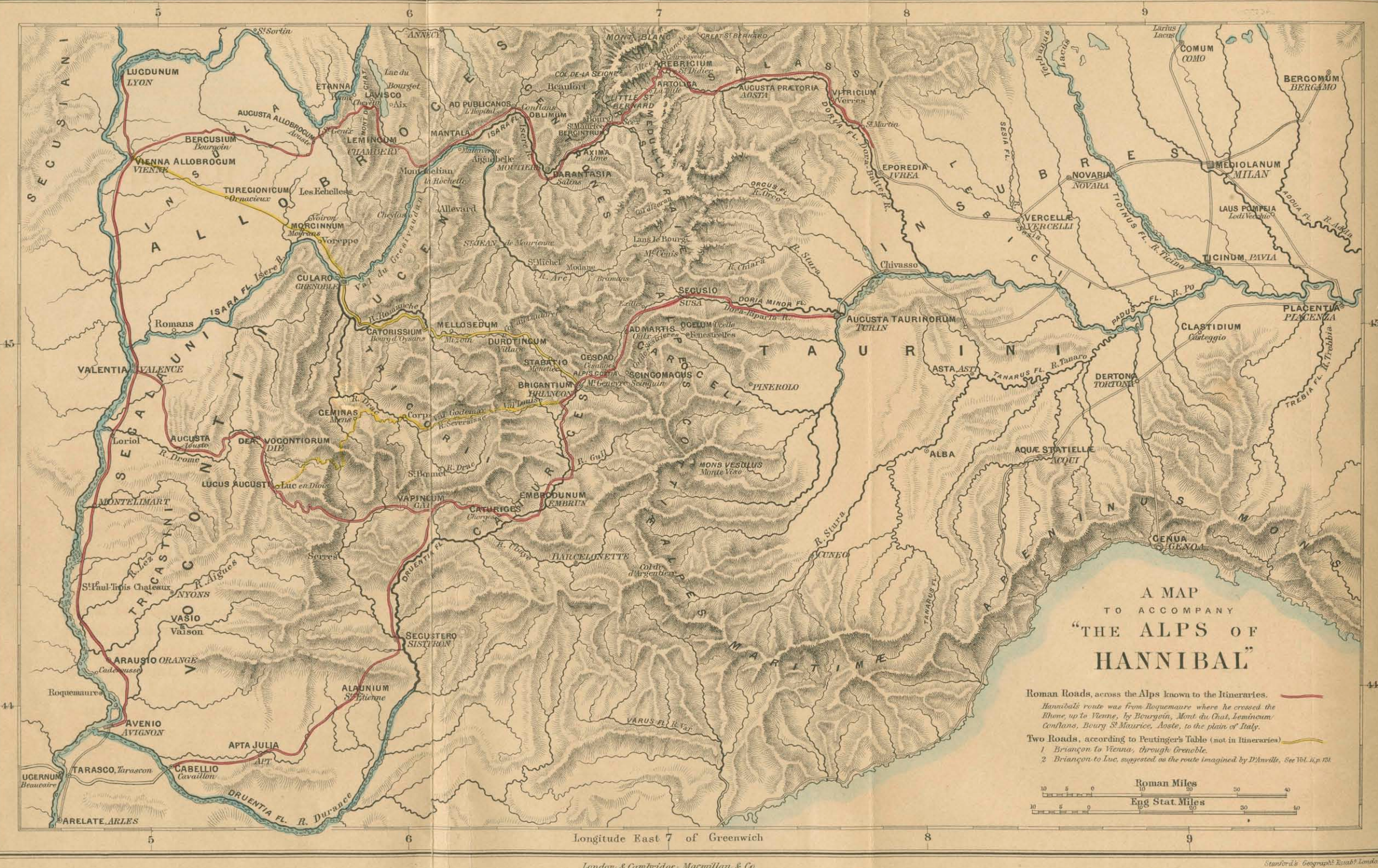




A MAP

Roman Roads, across the Alps known to the Itineraries. —
Hannibal's route was from Roquefleur where he crossed the Rhone, up to Vienna, by Bourgois, Mont du Chat, Lemincum, Conflans, Bourg St Maurice, Aoste, to the plain of Italy.
Two Roads, according to Peutinger's Table (not in Itineraries)
1 Briançon to Vienna, through Grenoble.
2 Briançon to Luc, suggested as the route imagined by D'Anville. See Vol. 1, p. 131.
