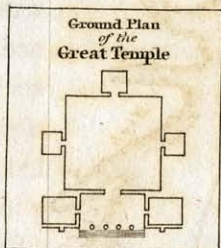


From the appearance of some of the Heights, it would seem that they had served as Posts of Retreat, in cases of Attack.

Aaron's Tomb

*This Arrow shews the direction of the large Temple
discovered in the distance and unexplored
bearing E.N.E.*

A. A Conical or Sugar-loaf hill only accessible by a circular flight of narrow steps cut in the live rock, leading to its Summit: unexplored.

B. *Precipice with steps about 400 feet high, very difficult of ascent, no part being practicable without the assistance of the hands. Near to this spot the unexplored Temple was first discovered.*

*Eastern Avenue of approach 2 miles long,
the Cliffs being from 400 to 700 feet high*

D. Tomb from whence the Colossal Vase is visible, bearing between N. and N.W.

E. *This Valley through which the Stream runs is very extensive, its end is abrupt & precipitous but there is one Exit in the right hand corner as you go up, which can only be ascended with considerable difficulty by climbing. There are Pines, Mulberry and Fig-trees &c. scattered about it, doubtless the remains of the ancient gardens.*

F. One of these Valleys is supposed to lead to the unexplored Temple: those that we examined end precipitously, & there is no getting out of them.
