**A. Content**

- p. 89, n. 135: for “Winnicki (2001)” read “Winnicki (1992a).”
- p. 146, n. 138: for note 532 read note 93.
- p. 161, section 5.1, line 7: reference to “Diodorus 19.80–4” must be removed.
- p. 164, n. 22: for 3619 read 1369 and see note to P.Count 2, l. 466 (p. 84).
- p. 201, n. 12: for “Third Syrian War” read “Second Syrian War.”
- p. 200 n. 9 about Syll.<sup>3</sup> 332, ll. 9–10: for “where Philip gives land to Cassandra” read “where Cassander renews an earlier grant first made under Philip II.”
- p. 213, line 2: for 800-aroura read 80-aroura.
- p. 219: remove “It remains possible, however, that some descendants of the 30-aroura men remained infantrymen even though they entered the *katoikia*.”
- p. 239, note 4: add page number “122” after Crawford (1971).
- p. 290, note 248: for Nelson (1979) 328 read 37–38.
- p. 318: Harmodios is *lesonis* of the local temple of the three crocodiles Psosnaus, Pnepheros et Soxis in SB III 6154 = I.Fayoum II 135 and NOT of Amun, as indicated in PP III 5380.
- p. 320, n. 66: add “Carrez-Maratray, J.-Y. (2014) has convincingly argued in favor of the identification of Aristonicus as the close friend of Ptolemy V, previously rejected, see Carrez-Maratray, J.-Y. (2014), ‘L’armée lagide sur le front du Delta intervenants et champs d’opération (encore le syngénès Aristonikos Caire JE 85743)’, in Véisse, A.-E. and Wackenier, S. (eds.), *L’armée en Egypte aux époques perse, ptolémaïque et romaine* (Geneva: Droz).”
- p. 354: Demotic should be *hsy* and not *hry* for blessed.
- APPENDIX - TABLE A.2. #3: add “Thessalian” after Cleon, son of Diogenes: for “*archikynēgos*” read “*archisōmatophylakos*.” (*archikynēgos* goes with “master of the Royal Hunt.”)
- p. 423: add “I.Cret. IV 195, 165.”

Note: p. 126, 171, 184, 215, 229, 254: the Heracleopolite land surveys of BGU XIV have been re-dated to the late second rather than the first century BC. See Scholl, in *C. Ptol. Sklav.* p. 977.

## B. Typographic errors

- p. 60, n. 44: for page numbers 86–98 read 86–89.
- p. 210, line 2 : for “unconclusive” read “inconclusive.”
- p. 264, n. 121, “Anabasis” should be in italics.
- p. 292: remove the extra space in Ἀπόλλ[νιᾶσ ται]
- p. 296, l. 2: for *syntaxē* read *syntaxei*.
- p. 342, 4 lines up: *eta* not *epsilon* is needed in Greek *parakechôrēmenês*.
- p. 352, n.107: “nos. 6” read “no. 6.”
- p. 369: Teos I \* => should be in bold and italics.
- p. 380: for “laarchos” read “laarchêš.” Remove “also laarchêš” at the end of that line.
- p. 394: Gozzoli: for “millenium” read “millennium.”
- p. 404: Paganini: for “Ptofemaic” read “Ptolemaic.”
- p. 424: SB I 599 should be the first inscription in the list of SB and NOT after 5827.
